12-24 MONTHS



- Native grasses take time to grow it may take up to 24 months to reach maturity.
- First growth usually begins 8-12 weeks after the initial application (this may take longer depending on the time of year).
- During the growth cycle, native grass sections may look bare or weedy. Weeds grow more quickly than grass. Once per month, landscapers hand-weed these areas.
- Allowing native grass to grow and mowing only up to three times per year allows seeds to drop and germinate. This creates fuller grass beds more quickly.
- Native grasses conserve water and provide cost savings to your community.
